## Women Development Cell

A number of programmes were conducted in order to inculcate the importance of gender equality among the students.

WDC, along with Anti-Ragging Committee, organised a half-day Workshop on the 'Role of WDC and Anti Ragging Committee 'on 4th September 2013. Ms. Kranti Jejurkar, Chairperson, UWDC and Dr. Mrudul Nile, Chairperson, Student's Welfare Dept. were the Key-Speakers. The Workshop was organised for the teachers of our own college, sister institutions and cluster college teachers.
